



Indoors, a flow-through lobby with natural stone offers unobstructed views of the Atlantic Ocean. After returning from a walk on the beach, 57 Ocean residents and their guests can either partake in the fitness center with indoor/outdoor training equipment, sunset terrace with spa pool and vertical gardens, and wet deck and lounge, or head upstairs to one of 81 residences, starting at 1,245 square feet. All of them feature Poliform cabinetry, Wolf and Sub-Zero appliances, and the kind of views namaste moments are all about.
